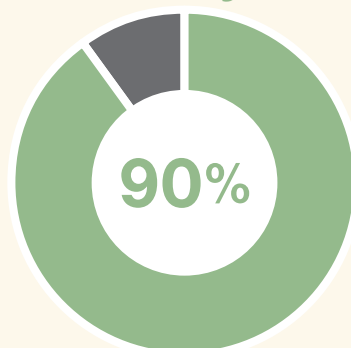
FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AND MEDICAID EXPANSION

2014-2016

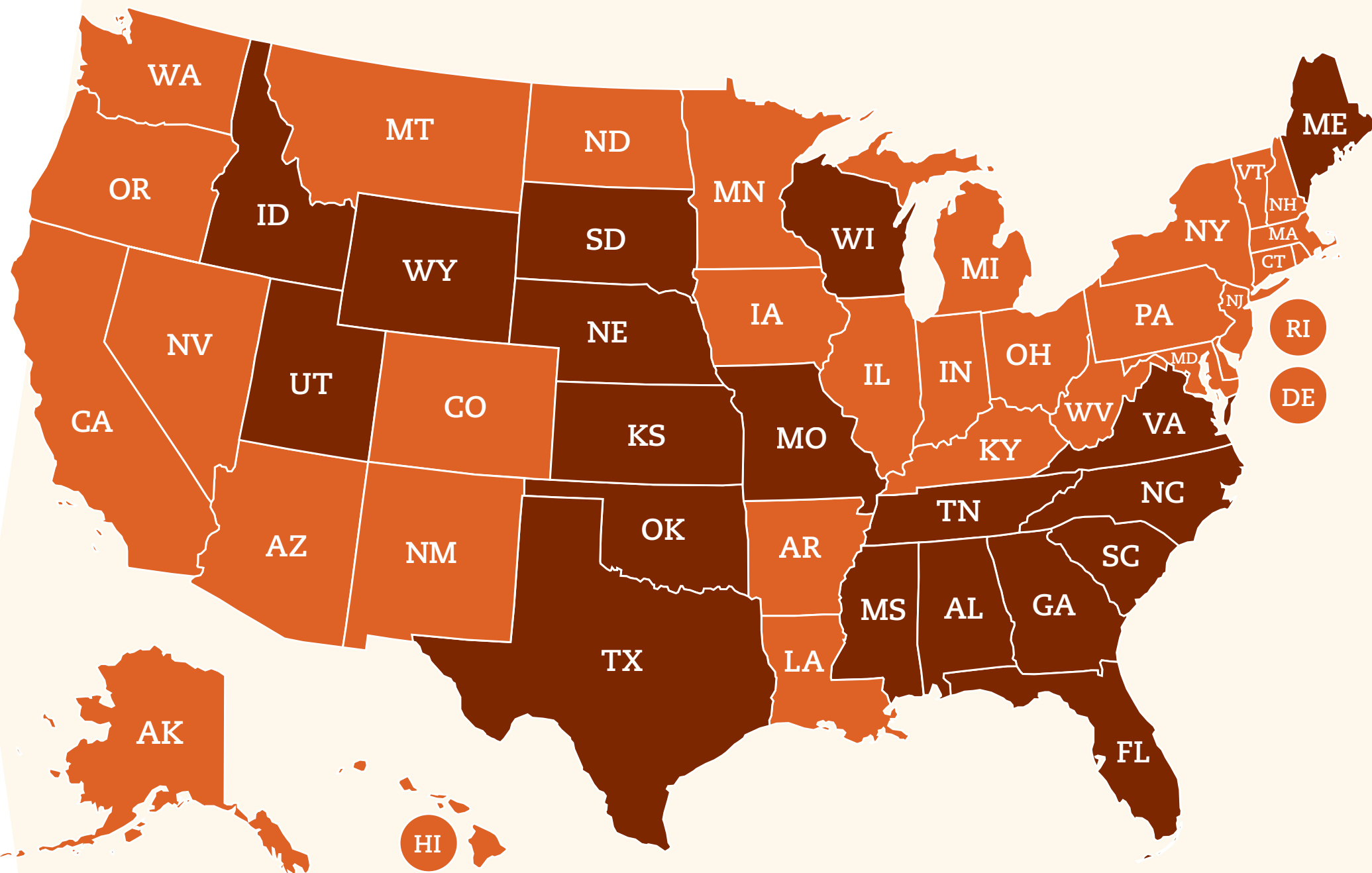


The federal government covered 100 percent of the costs of Medicaid expansion in 2014, 2015, and 2016.

In 2020 and beyond, the government will cover 90 percent of the costs of Medicaid expansion.
