Direct Service: Doula vs. Perinatal Support Person

Traditional Doula

- May or may not be trained/certified
- Birth Doula Provides Continuous Labor Support
- Provides Support to the family during labor
- Creates Birth Plan with Client
- Postpartum Doula Provides to Client After the Birth
- Encourages Breastfeeding
- Number of home prenatal visits limited to package selected
- Paid service by client

BBC Perinatal Support Person

- Trained/Certified BBC Doula
- Lives in the Community She Serves
- Cultural Humility & Empathy
- Creates Birth Plan with Client
- Provides Childbirth Education for client and family
- Provides Continuous Labor Support
- Provides Support During Pregnancy, Labor and Postpartum
- Encourages and assists with Breastfeeding
- Assists Client in creating a Self Sufficiency & Goal Plan
- Provides Sex & Reproductive Health Education
- Provide Parenting/Co-Parenting Education
- Provides Continuous Stress Management Support, Tools and Skills
- Service paid by donor, MCP, or other source
- Service provided through BBC agency







BBC Expansion

- Ohio Department of Medicaid
 - First Round \$556,000 (September 2016 December 2017)
 - Second Round \$556,000 (July 2017- December 2018)
 - ► Target Areas -44123, 44110, 44113, 44105, 44128, 44137
 - Currently Serving 53 women in target areas

Where are we today?

- 20 trained community birth workers
 - ▶ 1 in Akron
- ▶ 185 women currently being served
 - ▶ 53 Medicaid
 - ▶ 55 GUC
 - > 37 Other
- ▶ 96% full term pregnancies
- ▶ 83% spontaneous vaginal births
- ▶ 10 SOS Circle Cohorts
- 0 infant deaths
- ▶ 95% Breastfeeding initiation rate
