Dear Leaders McConnell and Schumer,

We, the undersigned organizations, represent constituencies from across the health care space and are writing to express our concern about S.2765, the Bipartisan Congressional Budget Reform Act, sponsored by Senators Enzi and Whitehouse. While the bill contains helpful improvements to the current federal budget process, the legislation also contains language that could force Congress to enact deep cuts to health care programs that are vital to the health and wellbeing of hundreds of millions of people in our country. In particular, we are concerned about the provisions in the bill that would create a new budget reconciliation process that, when triggered, would result in spending cuts far greater than the deficit reductions required by the Budget Control Act of 2011's failed "super committee". We ask you to oppose this legislation and ensure that it does not come to a vote.

Most notably, S.2765 restructures the budget process by requiring a budget resolution at the beginning of each Congress, and states that if the Congressional Budget Office (CBO) finds after the first year of the resolution the projected debt-to-GDP is higher than was originally included in the budget, Congress could pass immediate austerity measures under a budget reconciliation bill. If this provision had been in effect, every budget resolution since 2016 would have triggered the reconciliation process, allowing the senate to make several trillion dollars in spending cuts or tax increases in order to meet CBO's projection.

The bill uses reconciliation to ensure debt-reduction legislation passes quickly, all but guaranteeing that it will be a highly partisan process, and making draconian cuts in mandatory programs – such as Medicaid, the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), Medicare, Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP), and Supplemental Security Income – highly likely. This would have a devastating impact on millions of families who rely on these programs each year. In 2018, for instance, over half of children in the United States received their health care coverage through Medicaid or CHIP.

Cuts triggered by S.2765 would not only have serious, adverse impacts on families, but they would also be likely to make recessions deeper and more frequent. Almost certainly, downturns in the economy would cause CBO's projected debt-to-GDP ratio to exceed the budget resolution figure, triggering deep cuts to critical health care programs.

In times of economic downturn, the government needs to be protecting and shoring up Medicaid and other safety net programs, not imposing draconian cuts. This legislation would

require cuts to essential federal funding streams at the very time safety net programs are most needed by families.

Although Congress may wish to take steps to improve the federal government's long-run fiscal outlook, the Enzi-Whitehouse bill is the wrong approach. We urge you to oppose this bill and ensure it does not come up for a vote in the Senate.
