Finally, an alarming number of hard working [your state residents] cannot afford health insurance, making necessary health care too expensive and putting it out of their reach. Our health should not depend on our wealth—no matter our income or what state we live in. COVID-19 showed us that when any one person does not have access to affordable health care, we all are at risk.
